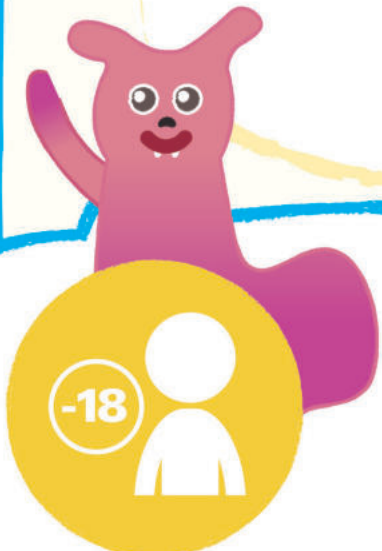

Leepa is going to visit Liz's house. Draw a line on the road to guide Leepa to Liz's house without getting lost.

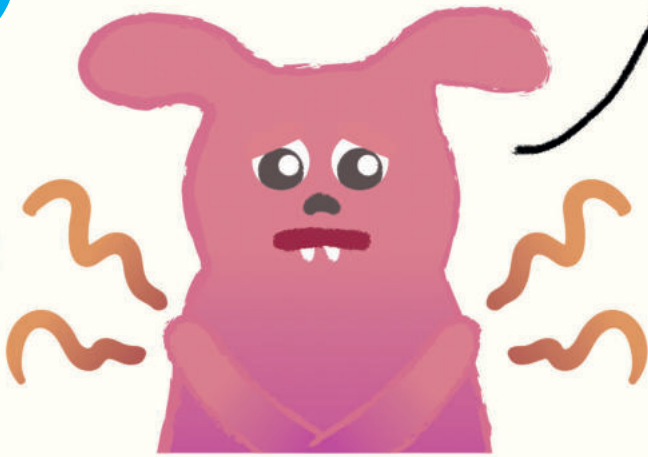
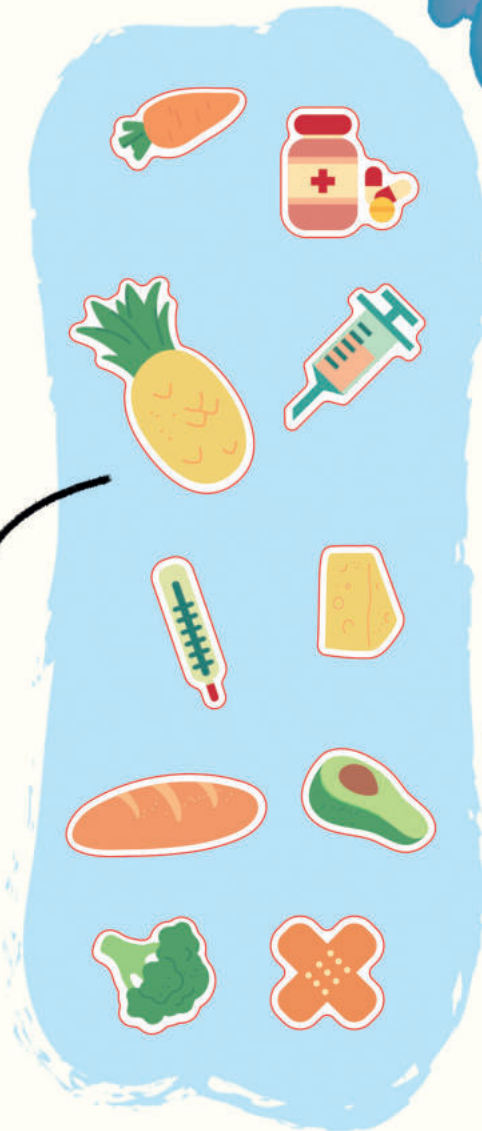
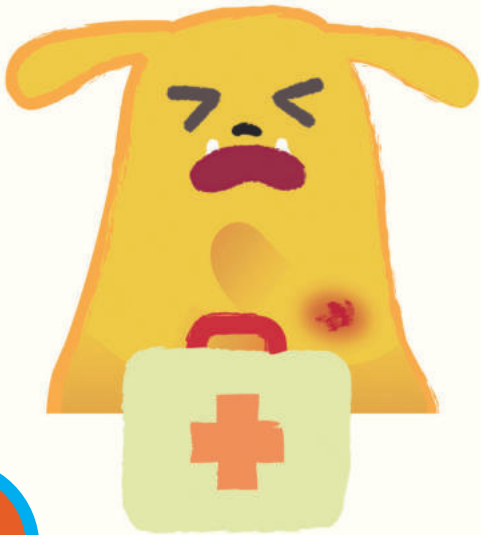


We all have rights!

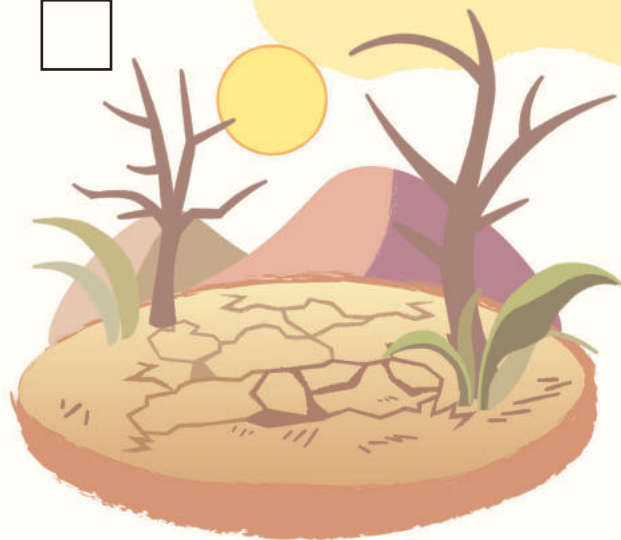
We all have rights!

Article 24: health, water, food, environment

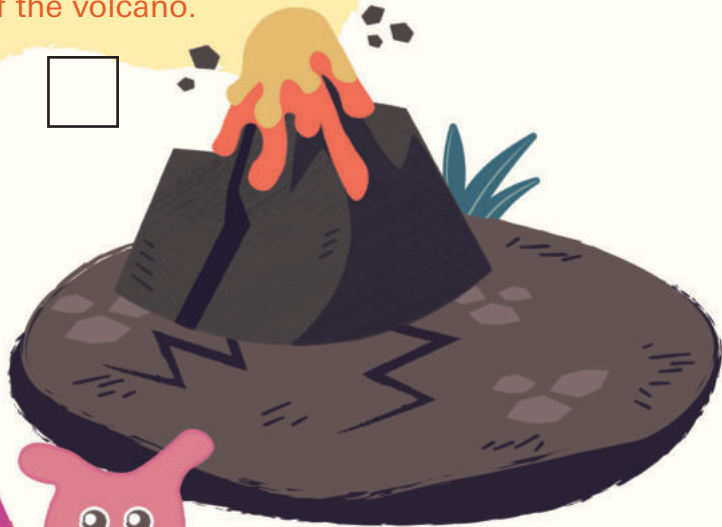
Children should have a safe home.
